A STAGGERING NEED

According to the Lancet Commission on Global Surgery:

- More than 17 million people die every year from lack of safe surgical care. That is more than three times the total number of people who die each year from HIV, malaria and tuberculosis.
- 5 billion people lack access to safe, affordable, surgical and anesthesia care when needed.
- In low-income countries, 9 out of 10 people lack access to essential surgical care.
- Researchers estimate that 85% of children in low-income countries will need surgery before their 15th birthday.

WHY AFRICA?

- The African continent is home to 1.4 billion people (17% of world population) with a forecast to reach 2 billion by 2040.
- More than 25 million additional surgical interventions are needed every year in Africa to save lives and prevent disability.
- Africa accounts for only 2% of the world's total number of doctors and 0.7 surgical specialist per 100,000 inhabitants.



- Baseline Assessment on access to surgical care in Africa conducted in 32 countries, over 600 hospitals assessed.
- Dakar Declaration endorsed by 13 African ministers of health and approved by 6 African heads of state in May 2022. The Dakar Declaration is a political commitment to improve access to surgical care in Africa by 2030.




STATE-OF-THE-ART PLATFORMS

Mercy Ships uses its two hospital ships, the *Africa Mercy* and the *Global Mercy*, to support its mission of bringing hope and healing to the poorest people in the world. With two ships, Mercy Ships expects to more than double the impact of its work, both with life-changing operations and with the education and training of local care providers in the poorest countries in Africa.



The Africa Mercy

- 6 operating theatres
- 80 patient beds including: recovery, intensive care, and low dependency wards
- Volunteers: 450
- Gross tonnage: 16,572




The Global Mercy

- 6 operating theatres
- 199 patient beds including: recovery, intensive care, and low dependency wards
- Volunteers: 641
- Gross tonnage: 37,000

OUR IMPACT

Since 1978, Mercy Ships has been bringing hope and healing to those in need by providing services and materials in developing nations valued at over € 1.4 billion and impacting more than 2.6 million direct beneficiaries.







A UNIQUE OPERATING MODEL

Our hospital ships, real floating villages, are powered by an average of **3.000 professional volunteers** representing **60 nations** each year: technicians, seafarers, maintenance and administrative staff, surgeons, anaesthesists, doctors and nurses, cooks, teachers, photographers, receptionists. The medical department represents 50% of the crew on board.

Did you know?

- We use **hospital ships**, because over 50% of the world population live less than 150 km from a coast.
- We operate with **volunteer professionals who pay their travel and housing costs** so we can channel over 75% of our donations to our programs.
- We provide **first class medical care** to the poorest people to give them a new chance in life.
- We offer our services **free of charge** to those in need with no distinction of race, gender or religion.
